



FRANK G. TAYLOE (1942-1998)

Frank started his reporting career in Norfolk, after which he worked in Washington D.C. for Ace-Federal Reporters. Upon returning to Norfolk he opened Tayloe Associates in 1978.

He served as president of VCRA and on NCRA's Board of Directors, working tirelessly on Foundation fundraising and on the Professional Ethics Committee. An avid golfer, he chaired the NCRF/Stenograph Gold Tournament.

Ahead of his time, he instituted videoconferencing technology at Tayloe Associates in 1990, seeing it as a way for attorneys to conduct depositions without the expense and time of travel.

In 1999 the Frank G. Tayloe Award was instituted to honor recipients exhibiting outstanding service to the court reporting profession, professionalism, and dedication to the profession, like the award's namesake.

A tribute to Frank cannot be complete without saying how much he loved his family, his dedication to the court reporting profession, and what a warm, caring true gentleman he was.
